

Future Leaders



Haley participated in the 2019 Future Leaders Program.

Being part of the Future Leaders Program gave her direction and purpose. She says before the program “I was disconnected between my authentic self, and who I thought the world wanted me to be... that separated me from the best parts of myself”.

Haley says that the program reconciled that disconnection and gave her the opportunity to learn about leadership and advocacy in a supported environment, and set relevant and realistic personal and leadership goals. She was also able to travel and meet new people outside of the remote area where she lives, enabling the building of networks and friendships across Australia.

The impact of the Future Leaders Program will be felt by others as Haley continues to advocate for herself and other autistic people, and teaches her TAFE students to facilitate the empowerment of people with disability.

Haley is excited for the future and says because of the program she could “reconcile my personal disconnection, then use my strengths and abilities to plan and fulfil some goals... it’s been life changing.”

Within six months of completing the program she gained paid jobs as a TAFE lecturer and co-facilitator in occupational therapy groups, and now has stable finances. The program also inspired her to re-engage with study, and start an advocacy and support organisation in a rural area where this is lacking.

It empowers autistic adults to explore and develop their leadership skills and networks to positively impact their communities.
