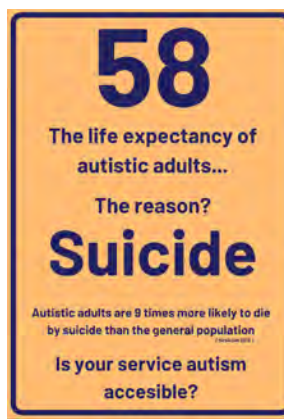
“Autistic adults are nine times more likely than the general population to die by suicide but when you are autistic the whole experience (of mental health) is different. Mental health programs have to be adapted for autistic people.”

As part of the Future Leaders Program, Lydia developed a poster and cards to alert professionals to the extremely high rates of mental health conditions in the autistic community, and what they need to do to more effectively communicate with autistic people. Through this Lydia met a number of influential people and has since been speaking at suicide prevention reference groups, systemic advocacy organisations and mental health events.

Because of her involvement with the Program, Lydia was selected to attend the One Young World conference in Munich, which gathers young leaders from around the world to

develop solutions to the globe’s most pressing issues.

Future Leaders has provided Lydia with the confidence and skills to affect change to legislation, government policy and community attitudes, but has impacted her personally.
